Dear Parents,

Welcome to our March newsletter update.

I trust you had productive meetings with the teachers at the 3-Way Conferences last month, and the feedback about your child's learning was useful to identify key areas of focus for the next steps in their learning. The teachers welcome meeting with parents for any discussion regarding their child's education, or their well-being at school. ### **Open House**

The Junior School held an *Open House* for Years 2 - 5 on Friday 01 March, which was an opportunity for the parents of Year 3 students to come and participate in the final summative activities with their children. It was also a time for visitors, parents and teachers from local schools to come along and learn more about how the PYP works in our school. This was a Science based unit on 'How the World Works'. The lines of inquiry guided the investigations:

- *Different types of forces and how they affect motion and position*
- *How we use scientific methods to investigate forces*
- *How we can optimize the effect of forces in our lives*

The students shared a summary of their learning in this unit through their demonstration of different types of simple machines they had made, modelled on what they thought would make tasks easier to do in different parts of our school, such as with an aspect of maintenance and in the kitchen. They also presented experiments on friction and gravity forces. The event concluded with a slide show of classroom activities depicting the trans-disciplinary nature of their learning. Thank you to the Year 3 students and their teachers, for an outstanding display of the PYP in action.

### **Parent Meetings with the Principal**

Thank you to all the parents of Year 1, Year 4 and Year 5 students who have attended our meetings with me during the term. It has been a wonderful opportunity for us to discuss a variety of topics that impact on our work with you and your children in the Junior School. ### **Year 5 Unit of Inquiry – Exhibition**

The Year 5 students have embarked on their fourth Unit of Inquiry – the Exhibition, a collaborative transdisciplinary inquiry which is significant in their completion of the PYP. We look forward to welcoming you to view the Exhibition, in May 2019.

### **Year 4 Field Trip to Shimba Hill Reserve**

The students in Year 4 went on an overnight excursion to Shimba Hills on 27 to 28 February, for their unit on the Ecosystem. The visit brought together the various concepts the students are learning about, as well as offering them the opportunity to witness how an organisation has enacted its responsibility towards the environment. Some of the activities they participated in included a game drive where they saw different animals such as buffalo and several types of antelopes. They also walked to the Sheldrick Falls and took a cool swim at the *pools* before going to the lodge. In the evening, they conducted interviews with the Kenya Wildlife Services rangers as part of their inquiry, and on the deck under the bright stars, they enjoyed traditional stories told by the group's tour guide. Some student reflections about their trip are:

- *We enjoyed the trip because it was interesting to see new animals and how the skulls look like. The rangers answered all of our questions and we also had fun swimming at the waterfall.*
- *We enjoyed the trip because we saw squirrels, buffalo and eagles, and it was so much fun.*
- *My experience at Shimba Hills was really fun because we did many activities. The activities helped me to learn more about the coastal tropical rainforest ecosystem at Shimba Hills.*
- *Sheldrick Falls, in the heart of Shimba Hills, is as beautiful as a rainbow. I hope to go back with my family.*
