### The Aga Khan Academy Hyderabad

- Location: Near Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Hyderabad, Telangana State
- Campus size: 100-acre site
- Campus design and construction:

• Admissions: Students selected based on merit, regardless of socio-economic background, faith, origin or gender

## Campus Facilities

- Sports facilities: 25-metre swimming pool, diving pool, gym, two regulation-sized basketball courts, three cricket pitches with net practice facilities, two tennis courts, four squash courts, hockey field, athletics track, 2.5km cross-country running track, junior play area
- Arts facilities: Rooms for fine arts, music, dance; individual music practice booths; music recording area; amphitheatre performance space
- Academic areas: Junior School classrooms, Senior School classrooms, science and computer laboratories, library and resource centres, arts facilities, music and dance studios
- Residential buildings: Six residential blocks: three male and three female; six dorm
  parent apartments in each block. Each block has a central atrium, lounge area, patio
  and laundry facilities

#### Curriculum

- International Baccalaureate (IB) programmes: Authorised as an IB World School for the Primary Years Programme (grades 1–5), the Middle Years Programme (grades 6–10) and the Diploma Programme (grades 11–12)
- Aga Khan Curricular Strands, implemented across the curriculum: Ethics, Pluralism, Cultures, Governance and Civil Society, Economics for Development

#### Staff and Students

- Numbers of students and teachers at full capacity: 750 students and 90 teachers, with 50% of students receiving some level of financial aid
- Numbers of students currently enrolled: 632 day and residential students in total: 140 day students in the Junior School; 492 students in the Senior School
- Staff numbers: 8 senior management, 63 Senior School faculty, 19 Junior School faculty, 42 administrative staff
- Planned student/faculty ratio (currently fewer students per faculty): 7.5:1

#### Residential Students

- Number of residential students: 245
- **Shared rooms:** Students of a common age share a room. At higher grades, often doubles or singles are offered
- Residential facilities: Student lounge with multimedia and entertainment equipment, study areas, laundry facilities, dining hall

## Professional Development Centre

The Academy also houses a Professional Development Centre to strengthen teaching in Telangana State by investing substantially in professional learning for local government school teachers. Areas of focus include literacy, numeracy and school leadership.

## The Aga Khan Academies Network

- 18 Academies planned across 14 countries in South and Central Asia, Africa and the Middle East
- 3 Academies currently operating: Mombasa, Kenya (opened 2003); Hyderabad, India (opened 2011); and Maputo, Mozambique (opened 2013)
- When complete, the Academies network will comprise 2,000 teachers; 14,000 students (boys and girls); 1,400 graduates annually
- Over the last 5 years, graduating students have been awarded scholarships of over \$35M from universities in countries such as the United States, Canada, the UK and the Middle East
- Institutional partnerships include agencies of the Aga Khan Development Network; the International Baccalaureate; universities including the University of British Columbia, Concordia University, Ryerson University, University of California – Los Angeles, California State University – Northridge
- Government partnerships include the Province of Ontario, Canada; the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, Kenya; the Ministry of Education and Human Development, Mozambique; the French Development Agency (AFD); the French Mozambican Cultural Centre (CCFM – Centro Cultural Franco-Moçambicano); the Department of School Education, Telangana, India
