

### THE AGA KHAN ACADEMY MOMBASA

- Location: Kizingo area in Mombasa
- Campus size: 18-acre site
- Campus design and construction: FNDA Architecture Inc. and PLANNING Systems Services Ltd. (architects); RK Boga Consulting Engineers (structural engineer); E.A.M.S. Ltd. (MEP engineer); Planning and Construction Management (construction project management); Stratton Castell and Partners (quantity surveyor)
- Admissions: Students selected based on merit, regardless of socio-economic background, faith, origin or gender

### **CAMPUS FACILITIES**

- Sports facilities: Swimming pools, squash courts, basketball courts, gym, junior play area, sports fields, including football pitches, tennis court, cricket pitch and a multi-purpose hall for indoor sports
- Arts facilities: Rooms for fine arts, music and dance, individual music practice booths, music recording area, and covered amphitheatre
- Academic areas: Classrooms and libraries for Junior School and Senior School, science and computer laboratories, resource centres, seminar rooms, arts facilities, music and dance studios, multi-purpose lecture hall, and performance areas
- Residential buildings: Six residential blocks, with three for male students and three for female students

## **CURRICULUM**

- International Baccalaureate (IB) programmes:
  Authorised as an IB World School for the Primary Years
  Programme (Years 1-5), the Middle Years Programme
  (Years 6-10) and the Diploma Programme (Years 11-12)
- Aga Khan Curricular Strands implemented across the curriculum: Ethics, Pluralism, Cultures (with an emphasis on Muslim civilisations), Governance and Civil Society, and Economics for Development

# STAFF AND STUDENTS

 Number of students and teachers at full capacity: 750 students and 90 teachers (8:1 ratio), with, on average, 50% of students receiving some form of financial aid

### **RESIDENTIAL STUDENTS**

- Numbers of residential students: 300 students at full capacity
- Shared rooms: Students of a common age and gender share a room. At higher grades, double occupancy or single rooms are offered.

 Residential facilities: Student lounge with an ocean view, patio, multimedia and entertainment equipment, study areas, laundry facilities, and dining hall

#### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The Academy also houses a Professional Development Centre (PDC) to build teaching capacity in Kenya by investing substantially in professional learning for local government school teachers. Areas of focus include literacy, numeracy and school leadership. Since its establishment in 2010, the Academy's PDC has partnered with over 1,500 schools in Kenya, with more than 11,150 external educators completing programmes with the PDC.

### THE AGA KHAN ACADEMIES NETWORK

- → An integrated, global network of non-profit, non-denominational, co-educational, residential Academies
- → Four Academies currently operating: Mombasa, Kenya (opened 2003), Hyderabad, India (opened 2011), Maputo, Mozambique (opened 2013) and Dhaka, Bangladesh (opened 2022)
- → Close to 200 students graduate from the Academies each year and have been awarded over \$12.5M in scholarships annually from leading universities worldwide, in countries such as Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom and the Middle East
- → Institutional partnerships include agencies of the Aga Khan Development Network, the International Baccalaureate, Global Affairs Canada, Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, and Safaricom Foundation; universities include California State University - Northridge, Concordia University, Huron University, University of Alberta, University of British Columbia, University of Northern British Columbia and University of Victoria
- → Government partnerships include the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, Kenya; the Ministry of Education and Human Development, Mozambique; the Department of School Education, Telangana, India; the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education, Bangladesh; Agence Française de Développement; and the Centro Cultural Franco-Moçambicano
