

Governor Impressed With Karam Amarshi

Karam Amarshi from Aga Khan Academy, Mombasa emerged first in Grade 5 category in the Top Art and Essay Competition organized by the County government.

The award ceremony was held at the County Assembly Hall on Thursday 9th February, 2017.

Karam was asked by Mombasa Governor Hon. Hassan Joho to elaborate on his drawing.

Karam explained that Mombasa was having many problems with the current Likoni ferries as they breakdown quite often causing traffic jams causing tourists and the residents of Mombasa a great inconvenience.
