Dear Parents,

These included a look at our school in terms of its mission and what makes it unique, professional development sessions on inclusion of students with different learning needs and group work around twenty-first century skills for learning. Four new students joined our junior school this week. The AKA Junior School children have assured me they have gone out of their way to help them and make them feel at home, and we extend our warmest welcome to their families.

On Monday 12th January we will have four new teachers joining us as part of the Teacher Preparation Programme; this is an extension of the programme which was stared in the Senior School last year. They will be spending eighteen months in the school for training in our classes and on-going professional development. They are teachers who have recently graduated from national universities with degrees in education. Each TPP trainee will spend time with our syndicate teachers as well as with Years 1, 3 and P.E. classes. This is to give them a breadth of experience across the age groups and curriculum areas. This type of programme is beneficial not just for the trainees but also for the school in terms of additional support in classes and exchanges of professional expertise and dialogue between our staff and the trainees.

Our teachers have already started to write your child's school progress report which will be sent to you on 30th January, 2015. Following this, we look forward to seeing you on the 5th or 6th February for your child's *Three Way Conference*. This will be an opportunity to discuss their learning and the contents of the school report.

The Enrichment Programme will be starting for the Junior and Senior schools on **Monday 19th January**. At the end of this letter you see a list of the activities which will be offered. The students will have an opportunity to register for these next week. We are delighted this term to include the Year 1 students in the programme.

This is the first of a bi-monthly newsletter from myself and my colleagues at the Junior School. It is important to us that we share with you events and learning taking place, to give you a glimpse into your child's time with us.

I look forward to seeing you soon and in the meantime wish you a restful and enjoyable weekend.
