Mombasa Students Achieve Impressive Pass Rate In The Annual LAMDA Examination

The annual LAMDA exams (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) ended on June 21st and once again the Mombasa students achieved an impressive 100 per cent pass rate.

The London based examiner, Mr. Edward Brierley, was full of praise for all the candidates and complimented their teachers Mrs. Jean Hughes and Mrs. Aliya D'Silva for their "much, much higher than average" standards and their obvious dedication.

This year there were a staggering 365 entries ranging from Stage 1 to Gold Medal and 81 per cent of these children gained Distinction which means gaining a mark higher than 80 per cent.

The majority of the younger children received Distinctions and Mr. Brierley was particularly impressed with their confident performances and the pleasing use of facial expression.

The Verse and Prose results were also very pleasing with very high marks.

The highest achiever was Ojaswini Pandey from Aga Khan who gained an impressive 96per cent.

Congratulations also to Aneri Shah from Oshwal Academy who gained a Distinction at Gold Medal.

The students entered for acting exams were also very successful and to be congratulated are Neel Patel and Philine Sanders who both gained Distinction at Gold Medal.

Keshni Majithia and Rani Shah gained Distinction at Silver Medal and in Grade 5 there were marks in the 90's for Shay Lakhani, Rumil Jayasinghe and Mohamed Amersi.

In association with the Coast Arts and Theatre Society, there will be a chance to see some of these young actors and actresses performing there exam pieces on Friday October 6th at La Veranda at 7.30pm.
