# **Our Parent/Teacher Partnership Literacy Development**

Here are some ways you can support your child's Spelling development at home:

Very few people can spell every single word correctly. Most of us, even if we are good spellers, make some mistakes from time to time. The important thing is that we know how to 'attack' a word which is difficult or unfamiliar. Good spellers are those who know what to do when they are stuck. It is very important that you encourage your child to 'have a go' at spelling words they don't know when they are writing.

There are several phases a child goes through to learn to spell, often without thinking about conventional spelling. Children will often 'approximate' the language. The 'Phonetic stage' is where children are able to prove a perfect match between letters and sounds. Letters are chosen on the basis of sounds and may not look like the conventional word. Eg. "On my brifth we had a isgrem cake and fo tey we had a pesda."

These are some strategies that can help your child during this stage of development:

- Continue to read to your child each day. Discuss interesting or funny words with unusual spellings.
- When your child brings home their writing, focus on the story and the words that have been spelt correctly rather than on the mistakes. Talk about the errors in a way that says 'you did a good job in trying to spell that word.'
- Encourage your child to make their own birthday cards, write thank you cards, letters to family and friends.
- Help your child to use the "look, cover, write, check" method for learning words, concentrating on the part of the word he/she is not sure about rather than the whole word. Divide the word into syllables.
