On Friday, 3rd March our annual Inter-House Swimming Gala took place. The event was a great success with a joyful atmosphere which was also highly charged with friendly competition from the students and teachers. The students cheered on their house mates as they swam and battled for points for their respective houses. In the girls' category, Red house (Falcons) emerged 1st after collecting 184 points. Updates on the PYP Exhibition (From the Year 5 Team)

This week the students focused on their 'finding out' part of the Exhibition inquiry cycle. They researched from primary and secondary sources, formulated questions, collected information, conducted surveys and held interviews. At the bi-weekly meetings the mentors help the students identify any misconceptions, misinformation and overgeneralizations in their findings, guiding them to more focused enquiry, information and data.

The next stage of the process is the *Proposal for Action* - a central part of the Exhibition in which students identify appropriate action on their project, and reflect on measures they can take to make an impact on their chosen area of interest.

Next week the students will be working on a written *Proposal for Action* which they will present to a panel of teachers, on what action they plan to take on their project. They will then work on the feedback given by the panel.
