Dear Parents,

In the last six weeks, a lot has happened in Senior school. Being led by 2 DP1 students, they conducted various workshops on reading and other activities to promote reading among the children from the surrounding slum area in Changamwe called Bangladesh. DP2

The Graduation Ceremony for the DP2s (Class of 2016) took place on the 21st May 2016, and 68 students received their certificates of completion from the Chief Guest and keynote speaker for the occasion, the First Lady of Kenya Her Excellency, Mrs. Margaret Kenyatta. It was a momentous and grand occasion.

It commenced with the Pinning Ceremony in the lawns of the school Guest House where graduation pins were fastened on each student by the Chief Guest, the Director of Academies, the Head of Academy, the Senior School Principal, and the teacher mentors. A toast was thereafter raised by the Head of Academy in honour of the Graduates.

This was followed by the main event, the Graduation Ceremony, in the Commons. The dignitaries took the stage first. Then the graduates and the marshals marched in with the traditional processional accompanied by the school orchestra's musical magic. There were inspiring speeches by Her Excellency First Lady Mrs. Margaret Kenyatta, The Director of Academies Mr. Salim Bhatia, the Head of Academy Mr. Bill O'Hearn, the Senior School Principal Mr. Francis Kariuki, and the Class Speaker (student) Ms. Racheal Ayugi.

These were interspersed with brilliant musical interludes from the School Choir, the Faculty Choir and the School Orchestra. The centrepiece of the event was of course the students receiving their certificates on stage, in full regalia.

The male and female Awards of Excellence were awarded to Raghuveer Vyas and Ruhi Manek respectively. The Ceremony was followed by a reception where parents, students, dignitaries and teachers mingled and celebrated together.
