Kenya's top swimmer, Emily Muteti of Mombasa Aquatics on Saturday set two Kenya records in the 400 and 200 metres individual medley events during the first day of the Coast Amateur Swimming Association Age Group Championship.

The event at Aga Khan Academy swimming pool in Mombasa saw Emily set a new 400m individual medley allcomers national mark of five minutes 05.90, shattering her own previous time of 5:10.90 set on October 14.

Emily managed to shatter her other national record in the 200m individual medley when she won the event in 200m individual medley event, setting allcomers record time of 2:25.94, breaking her old mark of 2:27.94 she held since October 13, last year. In boys' category, Danielo Rosafio of Mombasa Academy set two national records in 100m freestyle 14-15 years and junior when he took 53.65 to erase the old mark of 54.62 held by Tory Pragassa since October 13, 2012.

Two other records came in the boys 14-15 years 100m backstroke event where Muhammad Bilal Khandawala clocked 1:01.25 breaking his own 1national mark of 1:01.76 he set on October 29.
