Akram Wins Crown Silicone Stableford Challenge



In an increasingly intertwined world, if you dig deep enough you will find connections linking what apparently are unconnected activities and events.

That underlying interconnectedness between seemingly random occurrences was the theme of the speeches at the prize giving of the Crown Paints sponsored Silicone Stableford Challenge which was staged on Saturday 6th October 2018 at Nyali Golf and Country Club.

The theme was kicked off in his welcoming speech by Captain Taib Bajaber, an avid supporter of AFC Leopard,

pointing out the connecting link between football and Crown Paint who supported his club way back in the 80s and now extending their sponsorship to golf at Nyali during his captaincy.

The CEO of Crown Paint, Rakesh Rao responded by tracing the long connection Crown Paint have had with Kenya in general and Mombasa in particular due to the particular quality of their paints which are specially suited to the hot humid coastal weather conditions which makes Mombasa one of their most important markets.

Admittedly during this long history of connection with Mombasa, Crown Paint did not directly sponsor golf competitions under their own banner but that does not mean lack of involvement on their part.

As the Overall Winner Akram Sheikh mentioned in his winner's speech, Crown Paints have been connected to golf at Nyali through their generous support

over a long period of time of the Roland Koch Charity Competition, a competition that Akram is closely connected with.

It was therefore fitting and personally very satisfying for Akram to win the Crown Paint sponsored Silicone Stableford Challenge.

And Akram won it convincingly, without any challenge from anyone in the field of 140 players, by carding 41 points, ruling out any possibility of a count back, by making his 41 points with a great back nine score of 23 points.

With eighteen shots in hand, Akram played the 1st nine to his handicap, with steady regulation 2 points on all but four holes, losing a point each on the 2nd and the 9th but off setting the losses with 3 points each off pars on the 3rd and the 7th to end with 18 points.

On the back nine it was a blitz of pars, starting straightaway with first four holes and adding

two more towards the end, the 16th and the 17th which earned him a total of 18 points.

He added four more points on the two par 3s, the 15th and the 18th where although he dropped a shot each to par, his score was well within his handicap allowance.

The only loss Akram suffered over regulation 2 points as on the 14th through a double bogey, finishing the back nine with 23 points off his knock of four over par 39 shots.

Hot on his heels was Aameen Dhanji, making a great start with 21 points in the 1st nine despite blanking the 4th, through 3 points each off pars on stroking holes 5th, 7th, 8th and 9th and 4 points through a 2 club birdie on the stroking 6th.

To this total of 16 points earned over the five holes, Aameen added 4 more points through regulation 2 each on the 1st and 3rd and one more through a double bogey on the 2nd.

On the back nine too another blank, the 16th, cost him a couple of points but which he more than made up with 3 points each off pars on the stroking 14th, 12th and the 14th, the rest yielding regulation 2 points to reach a total of 19 points which earned him the top place in the men's category.

The next best score after Aameen was 38, shared by three gentlemen, William Kaguta, Martin Masara and Willie Mboté and a lady, Purity Mutinda.

Among the three men tied at 38 for the three remaining prizes, there was a further tie between William Kaguta and Martin Masara, both having carded 21 points on the back nine.

On further count back over the last six holes, William prevailed over Martin with his 15 points against Martin's 14.

Martin had made a better start with 7 points on the first three
